Margot's Florida Adventure

Early this February, I stopped in at the Fernandina Beach, Florida airport to say hello from New England. I'd driven by the field several times and expected a very small municipal airport. To my surprise, it was a newly renovated FBO with a small museum of artifacts from WWI & WWII! I thought the name unusual & intriguing - Bent Wing - till I learned it was to honor the military history on Amelia Island & the Navy's aircraft design of inverted wings to maximize storage on aircraft carriers.



The whole building is in the shape of an aircraft with FB on its tail.



The light-filled atrium lobby (the "cockpit) features a half-scale replica of the F4U Corsair suspended in mid-air.



The lobby furniture was made with part aluminum from former planes.



The reception desk was created from the fuselage and wing flap of a 1943 T-6 aircraft. It features LED-lighted strips of Marston Mat, the perforated steel planking used to create temporary landing strips during WW II.



There were signed prints of aircraft with the pilots' signatures, most notably the last military flight of Chuck Yeager over the Mojave Desert in 1997, commemorating his 50th anniversary of being the first man to fly faster than the speed of sound.



The gift shop was a delight with many memorabilia. The pilots lounge has an 80" TV, a backgammon/chess table and a Zero gravity massage chair. There was a Canteen with kitchen facilities & seating, plus a pinball machine. The staff was very pleasant and helpful. I heard that the ramp fee was waived if you bought Avgas from the self service pump.



It's definitely an FBO to visit whether by plane or car or on foot!
