Hi all,

I was inspired by what our new 99 President, Jan McKenzie, wrote in the *99 News* magazine: "Every one of us has dreams. We dream of how we can encourage women who become new pilots, of working with young kids to introduce and excite them to the idea of flight, of enabling women to achieve their next level in their aviation career, and of recognizing the incredible achievements of so many of our members who have soared. By working together, we will continue to make a difference in the lives of individuals, communities and the world. We will take the *only* women pilot's organization, The Ninety-Nines, to new heights. Reach out to your sisters and discuss an idea together. Then have fun and work together to achieve your new ideas. Implementing your new ideas will keep our organization fresh, updated and vibrant."

I thought about what she said in relationship to our Chapter and have some ideas.

I mentioned some ideas at our last meeting which will be discussed and voted on:

- 1. An Eastern New England Membership list accessible only through a members only portal in our website. Sherri is working on the portal and has already compiled the list.
- 2. Set up meetings for the whole year at one time.

A possible schedule might be:

2 section meetings

- A Christmas Party
- Scholarship Luncheon (If we have a Scholarship Chair)
- One summer month off
- 4 business meetings (where we discuss projects and progress).

Leaving time for 2-3 fun meetings including

- Community projects like air marking
- Having some of our CFI's give us a talk about safety/pet peeves/ funny stories.... (We
 have a lot of experience and knowledge sitting around the meetings. Lets use it and
 share it.)
- Continuing to have some of our members share knowledge and experience.
- Flying somewhere: If we have 4 planes and fill them up we can go to an "airport we've never been to" or some other destination.

Other ideas????

I'd also like to review our chapter goals. We support women in aviation, but do we want to do more than raise money for scholarships? Maybe we can strategize other ways to mentor our new members and student pilots. How can we reach out to potential pilots? Our demographic includes a student and a pilot who have young children. How can we include them in our chapter activities? (There is another young mom who just had her first lesson in late August and loved it!) Can we involve minorities in our outreach?

According to the last treasurer's report we have money in our general fund. If this money isn't being used for scholarships, it might be available for activities or community involvement. Someone suggested we rent the DC3 at Marston Mills as an activity. That may seem "over the top", but *Cape Cod Life* has written one article about our members; maybe they'd be interested in another article. *Chronicle* did a piece on Margot Cheel; maybe they want to do a follow up? It could be a great publicity activity exposing us to more people and attracting future pilots.

Our next meeting is November 12, at Marshfield. Come with ideas!
