Hosted by Girl Scouts of Central and Western Massachusetts on the Worcester Polytechnic Institute campus, GSCWM recruits some 60 to 80 education and adventure collaborators each year to give girls access to some of the region's top scientific and engineering minds as they engage in the exploration and discovery of science, technology, engineering and mathematics on the beautiful WPI campus. In 2022 an older girl track is added called Coding For Good to target girls in grades 9-12.

## 2024 Scholarship Application

Established in 1929, the Ninety-Nines is the oldest international organization of women pilots in the world. In 1931, Amelia Earhart was elected the first President, and the group selected the name "Ninety-Nines" to represent the 99 charter members.

#### Scholarships Offered:

- The ENE 99's Candie Oldham Honorary Scholarship (\$3,000) honors a long-time member of the ENE Chapter and is awarded to a man or a woman who has at least soloed.
- The William Bridge Scholarship (\$5,000) is funded by Eastern New England Chapter member Ann Bridge Baddour in memory of her father, and is awarded to a woman with at least a private pilot certificate who is pursuing an advanced rating.
- The Jeanne Ohnemus/Cynthia Hurvitz Scholarship (\$2,000) is open to a woman who is pursuing an advanced rating.
- The ENE 99s Takeoff Scholarship 1 (\$1,000) is funded by an anonymous donation to the chapter. This scholarship is open to a woman who has a student pilot certificate and who has flown at least 4 hours of flight training in the 6 months prior to application submission.
- The ENE 99s Takeoff Scholarship 2 (\$2,000) is funded by generous donations from ENE Chapter members.
  This scholarship is open to a woman who has a student pilot certificate and who has flown at least 4 hours of flight training in the 6 months prior to application submission.

#### Scholarship Requirements

- Must be a resident of one of the six New England states (Connecticut, Rhode Island, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Maine, or Vermont) who is studying anywhere in the US, or a resident of any state who is studying in one of the New England states.
- Candidate must be at least 16 years old and studying in some area of aviation, at a duly accredited school, college flight school, or flight training through an FAA approved flight school or individual flight instructor.
