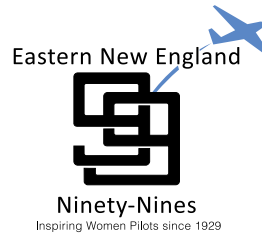


Eastern New England Chapter of The Ninety-Nines, Inc. International Organization of Women Pilots



2019 Scholarship Application

Established in 1929, the Ninety-Nines is the oldest international organization of women pilots in the world. In 1931, Amelia Earhart was elected the first President, and the group selected the name "Ninety-Nines" to represent the 99 charter members. Membership was immediately opened to other women as they became licensed pilots. In recent years membership has been opened to include women with student pilot certificates.

- **Eastern New England 99's Jean Griffin Honorary Scholarship (\$2,000)** honors one of the long-time members of the Eastern New England Chapter. This scholarship is awarded to **a woman or a man who has at least soloed.**
- **The William Bridge Scholarship (\$2,000)** is funded by Eastern New England Chapter member Ann Bridge Baddour in memory of her father, and is awarded to **a woman with at least a private pilot certificate.**
- **The Jeanne Ohnemus/Cynthia Hurvitz Scholarship (\$2,000)** is open to **a woman who has soloed** and who is a resident of or is studying in New England.

Eligibility

- Must be a resident of one of the six New England states (Connecticut, Rhode Island, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Maine, or Vermont) who is studying anywhere in the US, or a resident of any state who is studying in one of the New England states.
- Candidate must be of at least high school age and studying in some area of aviation, at a duly accredited school, college flight school, or with a private instructor.
- Must have financial need for the scholarship
- Must provide copy of at least a current 3rd class medical

Additional Criteria

- High interest and dedication to aviation as a vocation or an avocation
- Academic or professional achievement
- Involvement in aviation activities
- Quality of recommendations
- Financial need
