### 2025 Scholarship Application

Established in 1929, the Ninety-Nines is the oldest international organization of women pilots in the world. In 1931, Amelia Earhart was elected the first President, and the group selected the name "Ninety-Nines" to represent the 99 charter members.

### **Scholarships Offered:**

- > The ENE 99's Ann Bridge Baddour Honorary Scholarship (\$3,000) honors a long-time member of the ENE Chapter and is awarded to a woman who has at least soloed.
- > The Jeanne Ohnemus/Cynthia Hurvitz Scholarship (\$2,000) is open to a woman who is pursuing an advanced rating.
- The ENE 99s Advanced Training Scholarship (\$2,000) is funded by an anonymous donor and is open to a man or woman with at least a private pilot certificate who is pursuing an advanced rating.
- The ENE 99s Takeoff Scholarship (\$2,000) is funded by an ENE member generously donating \$1000.with funds matched by generous ENE chapter members. This scholarship is open to a woman who holds a student pilot certificate and a minimum of 4 hours of flight training in the last 6 months. This is the minimum qualification for this application. The best qualified candidate will communicate a clear path towards their next aviation goal.

## **Scholarship Requirements**

- Must be a resident of one of the six New England states (Connecticut, Rhode Island, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Maine, or Vermont) who is studying anywhere in the US, or a resident of any state who is studying in one of the New England states.
- > Candidate must be at least 16 years old and studying in some area of aviation, at a duly accredited school, college flight school, or flight training through an FAA approved flight school or individual flight instructor.
- > Must have financial need for the scholarship
- > Must have a current FAA Medical Certificate or BasicMed

#### **Additional Criteria**

- > High interest and dedication to aviation as a vocation or an avocation
- > Academic or professional achievement
- Involvement in aviation activities
- > Quality of recommendations
